Open Positions:

Professor of New Testament

Position focus: Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary (Puritan Reformed) is seeking a full-time Professor of New Testament located in Grand Rapids, Michigan. In collaboration with the President, Academic Dean, Faculty, and the Director of the Doctoral Program, the person filling this position will help assist and facilitate the PhD and ThM program in New Testament at Puritan Reformed.

The candidate shall have proved to embrace and advance the confessional and experiential character of truth. The person filling this position will contribute to the academic and spiritual formation of doctoral and master's students, as well as international collaborative research projects and scholarly publications. This position is a unique opportunity to collaborate with a dedicated team consisting of the current faculty, a variety of adjunct professors and instructors, research institutes, and the director of the doctoral program in order to help build an on-campus and blended-learning program. The person filling this position will not only be extensively involved in teaching and dissertation supervision, but is also expected to participate in academic conferences, departmental planning, committee work, and a local expression of Christ's church.

Essential duties 1) Teaching PhD and ThM-level graduate courses; 2) supervising or co-supervising doctoral dissertations, and master theses; 3) leading or facilitating research projects; 4) producing scholarly publications; 5) teaching MDiv and MA level graduate courses if requested; 6) participating actively in the church and international academy.

Required education and experience 1) Pastoral and preaching experience; 2) holding an appropriate PhD degree in New Testament from an accredited school; 3) experience in teaching, research, and publications; 4) experience in supervising theses and dissertations; 5) demonstrated experience of working independently and collaboratively with varied groups (faculty, researchers, etc.) within an international organization; 6) knowledge of current developments in digital research, distance education, and online publications; 7) demonstrated knowledge of faculty committee work.

Required ethos: Committed in doctrine and practice for the preparation of students to serve Christ and His church through biblical, experiential, and practical ministry. Formal subscription to the Reformed Standards of the Three Forms of Unity and/or the Westminster Standards.

Professor Historical Theology

Position focus: Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary (Puritan Reformed) is seeking a full-time Professor of Historical Theology. In collaboration with the President, Academic Dean, Faculty, and the Director of the Doctoral Program, the person who fills this position will serve in the Ph.D. and Th.M. programs at Puritan Reformed. The position offers a unique opportunity to collaborate in the seminary's blended-learning doctoral program with residential faculty, adjunct and visiting professors from across the world, and research institutes.

The successful candidate will wholeheartedly embrace and actively promote the confessional and experiential truths of the classical Reformed tradition. In addition to teaching, publishing, and conducting individual and collaborative research, the appointed faculty member will oversee and guide the academic and spiritual formation of doctoral students. Expertise in English Reformation, English Puritanism, and Scottish Presbyterianism is advantageous. The candidate will be involved primarily in teaching, research and publishing, and the supervision of dissertations, but will also participate in academic conferences and contribute to departmental planning, committee work, and a local expression of Christ's church.

Primary responsibilities: 1) Teaching Historical Theology courses in the Ph.D. and Th.M. programs; 2) supervising or co-supervising doctoral dissertations and Master's theses; 3) leading and facilitating research projects; 4) producing scholarly publications; 5) developing and teaching some online M.A. courses; 6) participating actively in the church and the international academy.

Required education and experience: The successful candidate will have pastoral and preaching experience; will hold an appropriate doctoral degree; will have significant, documented ability in teaching, research, and publishing as well as experience in supervising doctoral dissertations; will have attested success working independently and collaboratively with residential faculty, external researchers, and other groups domestically and internationally; will have knowledge of and experience in digital research, distance education, and online publishing; and have proven ability to work productively and efficiently on faculty committees.

Required ethos: We welcome applications from individuals who are committed in doctrine and practice to the preparation of students to serve Christ and His church through biblical, Reformed, experiential, and practical ministry, and who formally subscribe to the Reformed Standards of the Three Forms of Unity and/or the Westminster Standards.
