OVERVIEW

Since 1995, Puritan Reformed has been training students to serve Christ and His kingdom by providing biblical, Reformed, experiential, and practical theological education. Supported by a staff of sixteen and a resident faculty of eleven, Puritan Reformed provides a diverse study environment.

We offer courses on campus, online, and in hybrid format. Each course is designed to equip and enrich students so they can flourish in their joint spiritual and academic formation and serve Christ and His church in lifelong ministry. All courses at Puritan Reformed are taught from a biblical and Reformed perspective and emphasize experiential ministry.

There is close interaction between students, faculty, and staff at Puritan Reformed. To facilitate fellowship and community involvement, we host times of prayer, singing, and fellowship twice per week and attend chapel services together every Wednesday, followed by a communal lunch. While not all students attend classes on campus, Puritan Reformed offers many classes online or in a hybrid format. Students who choose the hybrid format can pursue their studies while remaining in their local churches. This provides continuity within their ministries but allows them to attend classes on campus several times per year to help them form relationships with fellow students, faculty members, and staff.


As for spiritual formation, Mark Kelderman and David Kranendonk serve as the deans of students at Puritan Reformed. In this role, they meet with students at least once per semester to encourage them, pray with them, and help them establish daily practices to grow in their faith, piety, and their personal relationships with God.

On August 1, 2023, Joel R. Beeke—the founder and president of Puritan Reformed—assumed the new position of chancellor at the seminary. Distance Student Body 56%


On-Campus 4.4.%



STRATEGIC INITIATIVES

A: TRANSLATION WORK

Translation initiatives for online MA courses are in progress. We plan to begin by translating these courses into Spanish, Chinese, and Arabic, followed by other languages in the future. Through this initiative, we pray that many more pastors, teachers, counselors, and scholars will receive solid Reformed theological training to glorify God and further serve the church.

Chinese courses are slated to be translated as we work with Nazir College in Bangkok, Thailand. Nazir College is a recent venture that emerged in response to the persecution of Chinese Christians in southern China. In 2019, a group of Chinese churches established an elementary and high school in Bangkok and have committed to opening this new seminary with 30 students (commencing September 2023). Nazir College aims to serve mainland Chinese and Southeast Asian churches and theological students, reaching the Chinese exile communities in Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, and Singapore. Jason Zhao, one of our PhD graduates, has been appointed as the academic dean.

The Alexandria Reformed School of Theology in Egypt requested the Arabic translation project. Puritan Reformed has a close partnership with the seminary as it serves as a global campus for Puritan Reformed. Sherif Fahim, one of our PhD graduates, will be teaching at the seminary.

B: DIGITAL INNOVATIONS

With rapidly advancing technological developments, we can now make our classes more accessible and affordable by using technology to offer more online classes. Harnessing technology to provide theological education will facilitate lower cost education for both international and North American students. Students can continue serving in their local churches and communities. This way, students can thus continue serving in their local churches and communities.

With the use of emerging technologies, we can now offer our students more flexibility in delivering educational material. We now offer more options that address the needs of students in their specific situation, whether hybrid, on campus, or online. Our programs include mentorship and spiritual formation components, and students receive robust theological training no matter the course delivery method.

- CHURCH EMBEDDED MDiv PROGRAM

This program provides online resources for students who study while remaining in their local churches and communities .

- ONLINE MA PROGRAM

The online MA program provides students with an accredited degree with courses shared with the MDiv program. It allows partner seminaries to provide classes and mentorship for contextualizing courses.

C: MANAGED GROWTH

With God's blessing, Puritan Reformed continues to grow. In 1995, we had four students. In 2023, we now have over 325 degree-seeking students. The strong leadership at the seminary, the committed board of trustees, and our faithful financial partners work together to lay a solid, God-glorifying foundation for Puritan Reformed. We take our stewardship seriously. Financially, we work within our budget and are fiscally responsible as we carry out our work. We are thankful for your continued support and prayers.

D: SEMINARY PARTNERSHIPS

Puritan Reformed partners with smaller, like-minded Reformed seminaries to aid their theological training by providing expertise and resources. Many Puritan Reformed alumni are in leadership positions at these seminaries. Today, we have twenty-three partnerships that, with God's blessing, will promote gospel proclamation throughout the world.

We stress the application of our education to everyday life and the church's works, including our students' piety and spiritual formation.
